Pronoun ref.	Pronoun reference – the pronoun is referring to an unclear person, place, or thing; you must tell who or what you are talking about before using a pronoun; the antecedent is unclear or the pronoun does not agree with the antecedent	It's where my dad was born and where they live.
Tense	You switched tense either from past to present or vice versa. Stick with one tense throughout the paper.	His birth name was Louis, but I decided to call him Wonder because he seems to wonder a lot.
